Typically, on the first Sunday of every month we collect the **HUNGER OFFERING TO BENEFIT ECUMENICAL FAITH IN ACTION**. EFIA continues to operate the food pantry and for the month of April, your financial contributions and volunteer hours helped feed 550 families. Year to date, EFIA has provided \$44,614 in crisis assistance funds to help area residents. In addition, Crossroads Medical saw 27 patients at no charge during the month of April. Finally, the New Life Thrift Shop remains closed due to Covid-19; however, the shop tentatively plans to reopen on June 10, 2020. Thank you for your continued support of EFIA as they seek to help those in our community that live in poverty.

STOCK THE BOX! The food pantry is need of replenishment. Items needed: canned meat (Spam, tuna, chicken, etc.), oatmeal, cereal, peanut butter, soup, canned spaghetti, ravioli, beanie weenies, beans, beef stew, chili, vegetables, etc. Foods that are packaged as individual servings and cans with pop tops are also needed. **Please do not put items in the box that are out of date or that have been opened and partially used.** Also, no glass containers. Other items needed include manual can openers, toilet tissue, dish detergent, laundry detergent, shampoo, toothpaste/toothbrush, deodorant, feminine products, and soap. You may either place your items in the box itself or place them in the crate that is in the narthex. We can also arrange for someone to pick up items from your home. 
