These stanzas for Palm Sunday have been selected and translated from a much longer Latin poem written by a bishop who was the leading theologian in Charlemagne's court. They are sung to a 17<sup>th</sup>-century German chorale, as adapted for these words in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century.
